 Please note that financial need is only an eligibility criterion for certain opportunities.
 - 2023 <u>U.S. Internal Revenue Service Form 1040</u> (first two pages only)
 - 2025-26 <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)</u> <u>Submission Summary</u>
 - 2025-26 College Board College Scholarship Service (CSS) Profile Application
 - 2025-26 Maryland Higher Educational Commission (MHEC) One-App Application, which can be used for <u>undocumented</u> and <u>other</u> students interested in financial aid from MHEC
 - Current enrollment in <u>Free and Reduced-price Meals (FARMS)</u> program

Students interested in the League of Educators for Asian American Progress (LEAAP) scholarship application must also submit two letters of recommendation from an administrator, school counselor, or teacher.
